#### CALL TO ORDER

President Watkins called the meeting to order at 6:07 p.m. President Watkins asked Member Grigsby to lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### ASSEMBLY MEMBER AL MURATSUCHI

President Watkins introduced Assembly member Al Muratsuchi. Assembly Member provided the Board with an update in Sacramento and the future of SoCal ROC's funding.

Assemblymember Al Muratsuchi stated that as a former Board Member of SoCal ROC this institution remains very near and dear to his heart and he continues to fight for state funding. Just this year, Assemblymember Muratsuchi assumed the role of Chairman of Assembly Budget Sub Committee on Education Funding and fought to restore the 384 million line item for the dedication funding for ROC/P's but was eliminated from the Governors final budget. In 2013, Assemblymember Muratsuchi introduced two Assembly bills to try and ensure the annual appropriation for the JPA ROC/P's but neither one passed the committee level. In addition, Assemblymember Muratsuchi partnered with Senator Ted Lieu to ensure funding for two additional years through the maintenance of effort. The MOE will expire June 30, 2015

Although most resources have been exhausted, Assembly member Al Muratsuchi urges SoCal ROC, Board of Education and JPA superintendents to work together and come up with a workable solution that will allow SoCal ROC to continue to provide CTE. Assemblymember Muratscuhi concluded by saying that he will continue to be a strong advocate for SoCal ROC.

Superintendent Hoffman introduced Raphael Guzman, Payroll/Benefits Coordinator. Superintendent Hoffman commented that Mr. Guzman joined SoCal ROC in 2009 as Payroll/Benefits Coordinator. During his five years at SoCal ROC, Mr. Guzman received his Bachelors of Science in Business Management from Pepperdine University and most recently received his Master's Degree. This summer, Mr. Guzman enrolled in the USC CBO school business management certificate program. Mr. Guzman is an example of an exemplary employee. Superintendent Hoffman shared that Mr. Guzman recently accepted an accounting position with the Whittier School District.

Mr. Guzman thanked the Board for the recognition and commented that it has been a pleasure to be part of SoCal ROC's team. Mr. Guzman stressed his support for Career Technical Education and the quest for ongoing state funding.

#### **GENERAL**

1. Board study session and open forum to discuss SoCal ROC's future funding

President Watkins stated that it is clear that the funding from the state is ending this year, SoCal ROC needs to look to the future. One avenue would be to form a committee, provide recommendations to the participating SoCal ROC Board regarding funding options. President Watkins stated that it is possible for SoCal ROC to remain open if everyone collaborates and works together.

Superintendent Hoffman presented the Board with a PowerPoint presentation on the status of SoCal ROC's funding. "What is known as of today, October 16, 2014"; 1) SoCal ROC's budgets for 2013/2014 and 2014/2015 is part of a MOE (maintenance of effort) signed by the governor as part of the State budget in 2013. The 2014/2015 school year is the second and last year of the MOE and will expire June 30, 2015 2) there is no current legislation that would extend the life of ROC/P's beyond June 30, 2015 3) the Governor has signed trailer bill language that allows JPA ROC/Ps to apply for the second year of Career Pathways Grant funds as an LEA 4) there is a possibility that the Governor's educational advisor, Cathy McBride, may visit the Center in November but there is no confirmation on a date and 5) there needs to be a plan for what happens after June 30, 2015 for SoCal ROC's funding.

After the presentation President Watkins opened the discussion to Board Members:

Member Fournell commented that this institution is important to his family. His own brother, who was not college bound, is a SoCal ROC graduate with a career in the aerospace industry. Member Fournell stated that there is a great deal of support for SoCal ROC throughout the South Bay. Member Fournell stressed that it would be a disappointment if the Center closed during his term as a board member.

Member Lucky stated that for over forty years, SoCal ROC has provided vocational education/CTE education to the participating JPA districts. Member Lucky suggested that every superintendent from the participating JPA meet with Superintendent Hoffman and Deputy Superintendent St. Gean in order to get a better understanding of SoCal ROC's funding and the proposed scenarios.

Member VanderPoorte stated that she believes the most equitable solution would be that each district pays for desired CTE services.

Member Grigsby suggested that planned conversations should take place with each superintendent whether individually or in a group setting. Most are in agreement that funding and curriculum are top priority. Member Grigsby remarked that all ideas are open for review.

Member Waller stated that SoCal ROC has the optimal model but believes that due to the financial problems some district may not be able to pay for those services. Even with budget reductions, the main focus is to provide the best for all students.

Member Ragins commented that CTE is essential for all students. Everyone must work collaboratively to ensure that CTE continues. Member Ragins stressed her support for a committee that will inform all superintendents and staff.

President Watkins shared that ESUSD's superintendent and CBO met with Superintendent Hoffman. ESUSD believes that SoCal ROC should remain in operation as it is currently.
