About SoCal ROC

SoCal ROC is a Career Technical Education institution located in Torrance that partners through a Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) with select high school districts to offer FREE hands-on, relevant, and industry-specific courses. These programs are designed to equip students for life after high school, ensuring they are better prepared whether they choose to pursue college immediately or enter the workforce. High school students not affiliated with our partner districts can still enroll; however, they will need to cover costs themselves or seek external financial assistance.

Earn High School Credit

- Students who successfully finish SoCal ROC courses will receive high school elective credit, with many of our offerings being UC/CSU A-G approved.
- A-G courses consist of a set of high school classes that students must complete to qualify for admission to the California State University and University of California systems.

Explore Career Fields & Earn Certifications

- Gain hands-on experience in potential careers and gain exposure to industry professionals, terminology, equipment, and environments
- Gain a competitive advantage on college and job applications by demonstrating mastery of industry skills through CTE certifications, and in many cases official state and national certifications
- In addition to the certifications, students will gain soft skills and industry exposure that is unique to **CTE students**
