Courses are open to high school students, grades 9-12 and adults interested in retraining, moving up in their career, or changing careers. High School students attending schools in El Segundo USD, Inglewood USD, Manhattan Beach USD, Palos Verdes Peninsula USD, Redondo Beach USD, and Torrance USD can attend Fall and Spring courses free of charge and if needed can be provided transportation to our facility. However, any high school student regardless of geographic residence may enroll at the Center.

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REGISTRATION AND GENERAL INFORMATION

Registration

In-person registration for summer and fall classes are now open. Registration is completed on a "first-come, first-served" basis. Late registrations are accepted if space is available. Classes must have the required minimum number of student registrations as of the first class. Classes may be closed due to lack of enrollment. Fees

Fees for all classes will be charged as noted. All fees are payable at time of registration. Please note students pay a fee per class that includes a non-refundable registration fee of \$25 and books and supplies are not included in the class fee. All high school students including in our Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) District students have to pay the course fee and books and supplies.

Financial Support

Interested in Advancing Your Career but not sure if you can afford it financially. Here at SoCal ROC we completely understand and provide several different options for tuition assistance. Along with partnering with agencies such as the Department of Rehabilitation, South Bay Workforce Investment Board, and CA Employment Development Department we also offer a 20% fee waiver program to those who qualify. In addition, Adult students can sign up for the SoCal ROC Reimbursement Program an initiative of the US Department of Labor - Employment and Training Administration (ETA). No prior experience is needed and acts as a great introduction to the healthcare field. SPDT positions work at all hours of the day and offer a flexible schedule in a full-time, parttime, per diem, or traveling role. (externship will be offered in the Fall for additional fee)
