Engine Performance I													
This course covers the introduction, theory of operations, and basic diagnostic procedures required to restore engine performance to vehicles equipped with complex engine control systems. Content includes electronic engine control systems, the diagnostic process used to locate engine performance concerns, and procedures used to restore normal operation. Students also will diagnose and repair complex engine performance concerns.

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Engine Performance II												
This course covers the introduction, theory of operations, and basic diagnostic procedures required to restore engine performance to vehicles equipped with complex engine control systems. Content include an overview of engine operation, ignition components and systems, fuel delivery, injection components and systems, and emission control devices, as well as currently used fuels and fuel systems, exhaust gas analysis, emission control components and systems, OBD II (on-board diagnostics), and inter-related electrical/electronic systems. Upon completion, students will be able to describe operation and diagnose/repair basic ignition and fuel and emission related drivability problems using appropriate test equipment/service information. Students also will diagnose and repair complex engine performance concerns.

This module teaches the issues concerning power quality and teaches the student how to use test equipment and procedures to maintain and troubleshoot transformers, distribution systems, and branch circuits. It also deals with power distribution via transformers such as single-phase systems, three-phase systems, and voltage correction through primary taps and autotransformers. It focuses on the selection and utilization of electrical instrumentation, proper interpretation of wire color connections, proper wiring techniques, through technical instruction and practical experience in wiring.

It provides students with technical instruction and practical experience in workplace safety, code-approved wiring techniques, and AC theory.

Students will develop an understanding of mechanical and electrical systems through project-based experiences in residential and commercial heating systems. This course covers the theory of refrigeration evacuation and charging methods. Emphasis is placed on the basic theories and applications of electricity/thermodynamics including the operational, troubleshooting, and maintenance techniques used for heating systems. Students will gain knowledge in electric circuits and controls, installation of HVAC systems, electrical motors, schematic wiring diagrams, HVAC blueprints, and diagnosis of HVAC problems using meters.

Students will be prepared for the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) exam to obtain an EPA license.

If the student completes the four clinical modules only, the Clinical Medical Assisting 450 certificate is issued.

Students will practice step-by-step instrument decontamination using approved sterilization agents and methods. Students will learn operator disinfection using approved agents and methods. Dental Module III (Radiography)													
This course provides entry-level training designed to teach students radiation safety and protection; recognize elementary anatomic landmarks for the purpose of exposing dental radiographs on x-ray mannequins; demonstrate a basic knowledge of radiological terminology and vocabulary; demonstrate proficiency in radiation safety as required by regulation; have a useful knowledge of radiologic infection control; demonstrate an understanding of the principles of radiation and radiological techniques through examination. Advanced instruction in radiation safety and protection; intermediate and advanced principles of radiology including film placement, angulation, and exposures; instruction in anatomical identification and interpretation of radiologic images; hands-on experience in exposing film on human subjects and advanced processing procedures and clinical competency/rotation involving x-ray labs upon successful completion of Radiation Safety Examination.

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Emergency Medical Technician ****													
The content of this course fulfills state and national requirements for education and certification as an EMT in order to gain employment as ambulance personnel, firefighter rescue, lifeguard, and ski patrol. The course also builds a strong foundation for the student who is continuing their education as a registered nurse, physician's assistant and medical doctor. This course includes first aid and lifesaving skills for trauma and medical conditions such as shock, respiratory and cardiovascular emergencies, as well as childbirth, splinting injuries, controlling bleeding, and other situations. Successful completion of this course prepares the student to take the computer-based National Registry Exam and complete the state certification process.

Intro to Animal Careers													
This course introduces specialized careers for animal lovers from training dogs to managing a zoo. There are many different types of careers for those interested in working with animals. On the local level, workers can groom and train household pets, walk dogs, run a pet store, or work in an animal shelter. Other opportunities exist in monitoring and managing wildlife, working with farm animals, and advocating for humane treatment of animals. This course describes more than 80 occupations in such animal-related fields as veterinary medicine, animal shelters, sanctuaries, and refuges; veterinary offices/hospitals/clinics and animal advocacy organizations. Care and conservation of wildlife; zoos and aquariums; creative careers; pet care, training, and grooming; pet food, pet supply, and pet merchandise stores.

Medical Front Office													
This course provides entry-level training in the medical front office. This course focuses on front office tasks such as productively scheduling appointments, utilizing professional telephone techniques, courteously greeting patients, and efficiently managing accounts payable and accounts receivable. The importance of patient confidentiality and of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) is emphasized.
